REACH Ministry Teams encompass & support every area of outreach beyond the doors of Grace to:

Reach the Lost,

Equip the Next Generation,

Assist the Poor,

Care for the Sick &

Help the Hurting...in our community and our world.

REACH Purpose Statement:

To reach beyond the doors of the church to our community and world, sharing the message of the gospel, meeting a life need and extending the love of Christ. This team incorporates the 401 purposes while exposing everyone we come in contact with to the relevance and power of the gospel and church community in their life.

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REACH SUPPORT TEAMS – These initiatives support all the teams within REACH. They work directly under the REACH Staff Office.

1. **MIP ADMIN TEAM** – Mission Impossible Admin volunteers who make it possible for all other REACH Teams to be successful. Working from home in Microsoft Office, Google Docs and our Grace Connect database and calendar, data entry, event scheduling, phone calls, emails, volunteer follow-up, tracking details and other administrative tasks. You can sign-up for tasks you would like to tackle from a project board. Admin support needed for every ministry team in REACH. (Serving time flexible; work from home; some tasks and training in office).
2. **TECH SQUAD** – Engineering minds with various technology experience creating solutions through technology to help REACH make a greater impact through apps, touch screens and other modes of communication and resource connection. Time commitment varies based on your ideas and solutions. (Final approval for implementation from Grace IT Department).
3. **SNAPSHOT TEAM** – Photo and video volunteers capturing action stills and videos giving the members of Grace a view through the lens of lives being changed. Assignments could range from a photo list of items from various live ministry events to shots taken around town at various locations in the community. These may be used for social media, REACH wall art, flyers and encouraging stories of impact. Your creative ideas are welcomed. Time commitment varies based on event projects and your availability. Four to five volunteers are needed. Training on Standards & Formats from Grace Media Department is required. Two to three volunteers are needed for each position below. Serving time can be remote and training is required from our Grace Media Team.
 - a. **Photographer** – Anything photography-related to support the teams within REACH as they care for our community. (i.e., Take photos of events, capture b-roll shots for videos, family pictures as needed for families who never get that opportunity, etc.)
 - b. **Videographer** – Filming interviews, stories of life change and gospel stories, capturing footage of events, etc.
 - c. **Video Editors** – Edit REACH videos to use for training, evangelism and inspiration as well as volunteer recruitment and congregation updates.
4. **CONNECTIONS SOCIAL MEDIA TEAM** – Scheduling, creating, and posting content on our Grace REACH Facebook Group page. (Also, see One-By-One Social Media Team opportunities in the REACH Center section below.) Work remotely with a time commitment of 3-4 hours per week. One to two volunteers needed. Training on Standards & Formats from Grace Social Media Department is required.

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REACH CENTER TEAMS – These initiatives are designed to help those in our community find hope, purpose, skills and connections to thrive.

(Each REACH Center Team requires one to two leaders to help coordinate events, follow up with prospective volunteers and communicate with the team. Training is required for most positions; serving time is flexible based on team schedule and volunteer availability.)

5. **REACH OPERATIONS TEAM** – The REACH Center at Grace will operate out of The Lodge until our Youth & REACH Center is built. This location will serve as the hub to enroll people in programs Grace offers to the community and the meeting place for distribution of those program resources. It will be open several hours per week.
 - a. **Center Hosts** – Working in the REACH Center by checking people in, answering questions, distributing resources (transportation and motel vouchers, etc.), connecting them with a Thrive Coach, managing the guest book, facilitating gospel videos/learning aides, and tracking progress. Times TBD with approximately 2-hour shifts per week. Training is required.
 - b. **Cleaning Team** – Keeping the center clean, sanitary and safe. Serving times will be based on center use and are flexible.
 - c. **Security** – To provide a safe environment for all involved during operating hours. Serving times TBD based on center use. Training is required by the Grace Main Security Team.
6. **THRIVE PROGRAM TEAM** – A program to help people, at various stages from housed to homeless, take the next step to stability and thriving. Our team encourages and walks alongside them in this journey, pointing them to resources and introducing them to the Gospel and the power of God in their lives. As a result, this benefits our church community as well.
 - a. **Thrive Coaches** – Coaches serve as lay pastors or mentors to meet with people face-to-face, assessing their next steps for stability/growth, praying, giving emotional and spiritual guidance, supporting, developing friendships along the journey, etc. More than four volunteers are needed. Time is TBD based on the center's schedule. Training is required.
7. **MONEY MENTORS PROGRAM TEAM** – Serving time is scheduled individually as needed. Typically, 2-4 hours per month per family is needed. Training is required.
 - a. **MM Team Leads** – Leading and training other financial mentors through the process of starting with a crisis budget working up to a thriving budget. Oversees aspects of communication and scheduling for this team.
 - b. **Money Mentors** – Six to ten financially-minded volunteer mentors work in pairs, meeting with individuals/families once or twice a month to review paystubs and help set budgets for stability. Work with this family as long as necessary (typically 3-8 months) to help them operate their budget while applying the

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principles on their own. Tracking progress, working with REACH Director, Coordinators and Thrive coaches for next step recommendations.

8. **PROFESSIONAL SUPPORT PROGRAM TEAM** – Licensed medical, dental, vision, mental health professionals, substance abuse counselors, case workers, trauma specialists, attorneys, insurance, tax prep etc. Offering free services within the scope of the license. Professionals will meet with a person identified as needing more support. They'll determine what they can offer personally or provide appropriate referrals to others. Serving times are flexible and will be on a case-by-case basis. Meetings can be done by Zoom or in person based on the need. This team can also help train volunteers on appropriate resources and responses. *(Also see REFRESH TEAM below for more opportunities for professionals.)*
9. **LIFE SKILLS PROGRAM TEAM** – Volunteers using their gifts, talents, trade and knowledge to teach people, in a hands-on setting, various skills that can help them improve their stability and quality of life.
 - a. LS Team Leads – Leading/organizing, implementing vision of REACH Director, communicating with all volunteers wanting to teach a class and helping with the details to make it happen. Seeking out classes based on current client needs. Serving time is based on your availability. One to two volunteers are needed.
 - b. Life Skills Coach – Volunteers who teach various life skills like cooking, carpentry, laundry, sewing, reading, GED, Spanish, English, mechanics, and so much more. Serving time is based on your availability and desired classes. One to two volunteers are needed.
10. **ONE BY ONE SOCIAL MEDIA TEAM** – **One-By-One Helping Arvada Homeless** (OBO) is a Facebook Group that homeless in the community join looking for help and where Grace members and others in the community can go to offer help. OBO is one of the portals we use to identify those who need help. It's also the model REACH Center teams were created from. **One By One Life Skills** (OBOLS) is a partner page for posting helpful information in an effort to improve lives.
 - a. Social Media Content Posters - Scheduling, creating, sharing and posting content on the OBO Homeless Group & OBO Life Skills page. Things such as REACH program information, uplifting quotes, stability tips and other community resources for food, jobs, programs, shelter, etc.
 - b. Social Media Group Monitors/ Messengers – Volunteers monitor membership requests, posts and responds to comments, and communicate directly with people who need help as their first point of contact. These volunteers will also start up conversations on FB Messenger with those who indicate they need help and direct them to the REACH Center or other resources. Four to five volunteers are needed. Serving time is flexible and remote. Training required.
11. **NEVER BEYOND HOPE TEAM** – This team will build two video libraries hosted on our website. The “**Gospel Stories Library**” & the “**Life Stories Library**”. These libraries

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will be shown in the REACH Center and possibly from the main stage, on social media, or at various events to show people the hope through the Gospel and living a God-centered life. People will be able to select a video to watch based on the thumbnail and captions under the video that they might identify with. People at Grace and in the community can share these videos with family and friends.

- a. *NBH Team Leads/Editor* – Leading the team and identifying various people from Grace to hear their gospel story and stories of life change. They will also identify others in the community who have a life changing story. Provide the REACH Director with the candidates' stories you have discovered. Schedule an interview and Snapshot person to film.
 - b. *Interviewers* – Will interview and meet each selected person, helping them to customize their story using our pre-written Gospel script or Life Stories template. All content will then be approved by the REACH Director and captured by a Snapshot Video volunteer. Two to three volunteers are needed. Serving time is flexible based on need. Training required.
12. **RESEARCH TEAM** - This team keeps our resources up to date, searching for housing and resources for stability, keeping lists of current providers, etc..
- a. *Research Team Leads/Editor* – Leading the team, assigning projects to volunteers, keeping resource handout and our online resources up to date.
 - b. *Resource Miners* – Unlimited volunteers; work from home with internet access. Some training required.

NEIGHBORHOOD TEAMS – These initiatives provide events and services to our Grace Church neighborhood and city.

(Each REACH Neighborhood Team requires one to two leaders to help coordinate events, follow up with prospective volunteers and communicate with the team. Time is based on team event schedule and volunteer availability. Some teams are still in need of leaders. If you are interested in leading please contact REACH Office.)

13. **BACKPACK DRIVE TEAM** – Annual event for Willow Green kids. 1-5 hour time commitment. Dinner is provided and families can load free backpacks with school supplies donated from Grace Church members.
- a. *BP Team Leads* – Leading/organizing event, implementing vision, working with REACH Director, communicating with volunteers. One to two volunteers are needed with a serving time of 15-20 hours between June-August. The actual event at Grace lasts approximately 8 hours. Time is flexible and can be done remotely.
 - b. *Supply Sorters* – Sorting school supplies onto tables, organizing, etc. Five to ten volunteers are needed. Time commitment is a single event that lasts approximately three hours. One weekday morning or afternoon in mid-August.

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- c. Event Hosts – Helping families fill backpacks, manning photo booth, grilling and serving food, etc. Five to seven volunteers are needed with a one-time 4-hour commitment in mid-August.
 - d. Photo Booth Host – Operating the photo booth, engaging with families, etc. One to two volunteers are needed with a single commitment of approximately four hours one weekday evening in mid-August.
14. **HOLIDAY BLESSING TEAM** – Annual event to bless the families in Willow Green. Grace small groups will be paired with a family that signs up to participate. At each holiday, groups will provide the families with a box/basket of items that promote holiday cheer and family time as well as a spiritual/gospel element.
- a. HB Team Leads – Leading/organizing event, implementing vision, working with REACH Director, communicating with families, engaging more volunteers as needed. One to two volunteers are needed. Time commitment is approximately 20-25 hours between October-December working remotely.
15. **OPEN HEARTS** - Support and care for residents of Life Care Center of Westminster. Opportunities to serve include preparing gifts, crafts and visiting with residents approximately six times a year.
- c. OH Team Leads – Volunteers who coordinate visits and communicate with volunteers.
 - d. Care Volunteers – Willing to visit the Life Care Center. Five to six volunteers are needed with a serving time of approximately two to three hours per week. This will repeat six times per year.
 - e. Seasonal Volunteers – Willing to help with holiday events like the Santa Shop, etc.
16. **REFRESH TEAM** – Looking for opportunities to care for those who need encouragement, refreshing, hope, prayer and support through various life circumstances. Hosting events, visitations, sending care packages, support groups, and offering comfort resources. (i.e. hospital visits, hope breakfasts for cancer/terminal illness patients, prayer drive through, crafts for anxiety, making memory books for loved ones, Celebrating Sobriety, shoveling for elderly, working with Revital to host coffee shop hours for Arvada first responders, etc.)
- a. RF Team Leads – Finding and coordinating opportunities to care for those who need encouragement, refreshing, hope, prayer and support through various life circumstances. Creating events, visitations, hosting support groups, and offering comfort resources. (i.e. hospital visits, hope breakfasts for cancer/terminal illness patients, prayer drive through, craft times, memory books for loved ones, etc.)
 - b. Encouragers – Volunteers who have gifts of mercy /compassion who enjoy caring for people, willing to sit and pray, help serve breakfast, visit people in facilities and hospitals, engage in conversation, etc.

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- c. Crafters – Using specific type crafts to relief anxiety, bring refreshing, and create keepsakes reminding them of God’s love. (memory books for lost loved ones, sobriety calendars celebrating victory, clay flowers teaching God’s principles of being molded by our creator, acrylic pours teaching God working all things together for good, making custom blankets, etc.)
 - d. Care Givers – Professionals with experience in various medical, mental health, recovery, end of life care, etc. volunteering their time outside of their job to give comfort and hope, sharing their knowledge for pain relief, assurance or suggestions for management to someone going through various physical and emotional related health crisis.
17. **CLEAN WHEELING CLUB** – Volunteers who enjoy riding bikes pick-up trash from bike trails near the church and in the city of Arvada while enjoying fellowship along the way. You can invite neighbors and friends to ride as they will have the opportunity to hear the Gospel at the beginning of each ride.
- f. CW Team Leads – Enjoy cycling, scoping out trails that need attention, organizing the ride and communicating with riders, etc. One to two volunteers needed, and the serving time is flexible based on bike events. Organizing done remotely with event time of approximately two hours each ride including 30 minutes prep/prayer time on each side of the ride. Training is required.
 - g. Cyclists – Volunteers can sign-up to be regular members of the team or can sign-up to join per event.
18. **SHOW ME GROW ME TEAM** – Offering free events, classes and clubs to kids and adults in our community in areas that can better equip or enrich their life. **(MUSIC, ART, SEWING, COOKING, LANGUAGE, etc.)** There are many different types of classes we could offer, but they depend on YOU! What can you offer? Below are just a few examples. Basic Language - English to Spanish (or Spanish to English, adding other languages if need arises), simple music concepts (helping them understand reading and playing) or simple art concepts (drawing, sketching, color, basic computer, graphics, etc.) that can help develop passion, skills, and future opportunities.
- h. SMGM Team Leads – One to two volunteers per club working with various members of our congregation to help develop program ideas, look for skilled individuals from Grace to teach, and find ways to offer this to the community as well. Serving time is flexible and training is required.
 - i. Musicians/Artists – Volunteers with skills willing to tutor kids (ages 5-18) who cannot afford these opportunities. It’s preferable if the volunteer can provide the instruments and materials necessary. We can discuss each club on a case-by-case basis to see how we can accommodate. Would be best if instruments are portable and can be set-up/removed after each class as the Center has no storage. Serving time is flexible to program, ongoing or possibly 6-12 week

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sessions two times a year based on the need. Classes preferably held at Grace REACH Center. Background check required.

- j. Spanish Speakers – Fluent in both Spanish and English and able to facilitate group sessions to help teach both basics and advanced speaking groups. Helping those who need to learn English and others who need to learn Spanish.
- k. Needle Knows – Seamstresses, quilters and other volunteers with sewing-based gifts can teach basic mending and alteration skills in addition to more advanced skills for functional items like clothing, blankets, etc.

COMMUNITY PARTNER TEAMS – These initiatives were founded by outside ministries or non-profits that partner with Grace Church to reach our community.

(Each REACH Community Partner Team requires one to two Liaison Coordinators to help communicate with Grace and the other Non-profit ministry involved to coordinate events, follow up with prospective volunteers and communicate with those serving. Time is based on team event schedule and volunteer availability from the community partner. Some teams are still in need of Coordinators. If you are interested in serving in this capacity please contact REACH Office.)

- 19. **WHIZ KIDS TEAM** – Helping kids build confidence, skills and relationships that give them a future and a hope. We do this by providing one-to-one tutoring, positive mentoring relationships and spiritual nurturing in the name and with the love of Jesus Christ. Takes place annually during the school year and the time commitment is 1.5 hours a week during September–April.
 - a. WK Liaison Coordinator – Meets with the outside organization and the Grace REACH Director to identify needs/solutions. This can truly be a partnership and collaborative effort of vision/mission of both organizations; bringing opportunities to Grace to both participate/collaborate. Oversees overall communication and events.
 - b. Tutors – One-to-one tutoring for elementary age students. Fifteen volunteers with a serving commitment of approximately 1.5 hours on Thursdays from 3:45 p.m. – 5:15 p.m. Training and materials provided by Whiz Kids. You just need to be able to read and love a child!
 - c. Club leader – Leads games, songs, and shares 15-minute Bible story/gospel message provided by Whiz Kids. One to two volunteers are needed with a serving commitment of 30-45 minutes on Thursdays from approximately 4:40 p.m.–5:15 p.m. Training and materials are required.
 - d. Van Driver – Using Grace vans, pick kids up at Swanson Elementary and bring them to Grace. Two to four volunteers needed with a serving commitment time of approximately 30 min on Thursdays between 3:15 p.m.-3:45 p.m.

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20. **FEEDING THE FUTURE TEAM** – Annual opportunity (provided by Arvada Community Table Food Bank) to feed Swanson Elementary and Parr Elementary students in need of nutritional, self-serve meals on the weekend. Volunteers needed during school year (September–April).
 - l. *FTF Liaison Coordinator* – Meets with the outside organization and Grace REACH Director to identify needs/solutions that can truly be a partnership and collaborative effort of vision/mission of both organizations; bringing opportunities to Grace to both participate and cooperate. One to two volunteers are needed with a serving time of approximately 1 hour, 1 weekday at Grace through school season. Five to ten hours of pre-season prep time organizing, communicating with volunteers, schools and food banks. Hours are flexible and can be done remotely. (***This position is currently filled.***)
 - a. *Food Prep Volunteers* – Sort food into student bags and label them. Five to ten volunteers with a serving commitment of an hour a weekday at Grace.
21. **OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD TEAM** – Weekend Booth Workers/Organizers
 - m. *OCC Liaison Coordinator* – Meets with the outside organization and Grace REACH Director to identify needs/solutions that can truly be a partnership/collaborative effort of vision/mission of both organizations; bringing opportunities to Grace to both participate and collaborate. Oversees all communications and events. One to two volunteers are needed for pre-season prep time in addition to being present for all weekend services for four weekends during event (Typically in Oct-Nov).
 - a. *Weekend Booth Volunteers* – Collecting and distributing boxes for four weekends through the event. Sign-up for one service or all. Weekends are in mid to late-October/early-November.
 - b. *Materials, Packing & Delivery* – Folding boxes, stuffing with brochures, helping to pack shoe boxes into cartons and drop off at regional collection site. Volunteer serving time is approximately five hours (some weekday and weekends services).
 - c. *Distribution Center Volunteers*
22. **REVITAL COLORADO TEAM** – Revital provides free full-day and half-day outdoor activities for first responders. Fly fishing, golf outings, archery, range time, and scenic side-by-side trips are just a few examples, as well as a variety of different relationship building activities for spouses and families of first responders.
 - n. *RC Liaison Coordinator* – Meets with the outside organization and Grace REACH Director to identify needs/solutions that can truly be a partnership and collaborative effort of vision and mission of both organizations. This brings opportunities to Grace to both participate and collaborate. Oversees all communication and events.
 - a. *Trip Hosts* – Host does not have to be a first responders to host, but that would be a plus. Volunteer hosts would be those who have experience and the ability

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to host some type of outdoor activity for first responders to get away from their stress.

- b. Family Support Hosts – Volunteers who can host/provide a group activity for first responders to do with their families. This can range from crafts to BBQ's and more.
23. **KAIROS TEAM** – A lay-led, interdenominational Christian ministry in which men and women volunteers bring Christ's love and forgiveness to prisoners and their families.
- o. KR Liaison Coordinators – Meets with the outside organization and Grace REACH Director to find needs/solutions that can truly be a partnership and collaborative effort of vision and mission of both organizations. This brings opportunities for Grace to both participate and collaborate. Oversees the communication and events.
 - p. Volunteer roles not specified at this point, call REACH Director for more info.
24. **HOPE HOUSE TEAM** – Provides free self-sufficiency programs to parenting teen moms.
- q. HH Team Liaison Coordinator – Meets with the outside organization and Grace REACH director to find needs/solutions that can truly be a partnership and collaborative effort of vision and mission of both organizations. This brings opportunities for Grace to both participate and collaborate. Oversees the communication and events. One to two volunteers are needed. Serving time TBD.
 - r. Volunteer roles not specified at this point. Once we have a coordinator we can see if and how we can partner.

INNOVATE TEAMS – These initiatives create events, business, items and opportunities to raise money for our local outreach efforts, while also providing services of connection or enjoyment for the community as possible.

(Each REACH Innovate Team requires one to two leaders to help coordinate events, follow up with prospective volunteers and communicate with the team. Serving time is based on team event schedule and volunteer availability. Some teams are still in need of leaders. If you are interested in leading please contact REACH Office.)

25. **GRACE GOLF TOURNAMENT TEAM** – Signing-up teams of golfers and gathering sponsors from within Grace and our community. Organizing a tournament and reward. A family putting event or Topgolf can be organized alongside to allow non-golfers to participate in the fun.
- a. Golf Team Leads – Leading/organizing event, contacting golf courses, implementing vision, organizing tournament, awards, etc. Working with REACH Director, communicating with volunteers, etc. One to two volunteers are

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needed with flexible time commitments while working remotely planning the outings and events.

- b. *Golf Event Volunteers* – Working to sign-up golfers and helping out at the Golf Course, manning tables and the holes, in addition to helping with the awards. Five to ten volunteers are needed with a serving time of 2-3 days per year.
 - c. *Sponsor & Golfer Volunteers* – Working to get businesses and individuals to sponsor holes and get golfers signed-up. Time commitment is 5-10 hours once per year. Flexible hours working remotely and coming into Grace as needed for meetings, etc. Manning kiosk in foyer to sign up golfers 1-2 weekends per year (spring to early summer).
26. **REACH MISSIONS AUCTION TEAM** – Working with business and individual sponsors within the Grace congregation and in our community to secure valuable commitments that can generate income, while also appealing and fun for an auction event. Night of fun and fellowship around the mission and vision.
- a. *Auction Team Leads* – Leading/organizing event, implementing vision, working with REACH Director, communicating with volunteers, etc. One to two volunteers needed. The service time is flexible while working remotely. These team leads would follow the project through from planning and promoting stage to the actual event.
 - b. *Sponsorship Volunteers* – Working to get businesses and individuals to donate auction and service items for bidding purposes. One to two volunteers are needed with a flexible serving commitment of 2-3 months leading up to an event.
 - c. *Event Volunteers* – Help with event set-up, decorations, check-in, bid displays, bid tracking, etc. Five to ten volunteers are needed with a flexible serving commitment time of 2-3 days before and day of event.
27. **BRIDGE BUILDERS TEAM** – Business-minded individuals who have various skills from company start-ups, business owners, managers, financial planners, business forecasters, legal advisors, etc. to help bridge the gap to stability through creating employment opportunities for people we serve that may also serve as sustainable income opportunities for Grace.
- a. *BB Team Leads* – Leading/organizing event, implementing vision, working with REACH Director, communicating with volunteers, etc. One to two volunteers are needed with a flexible serving time while working remotely. Leading and attending meetings scheduled for the team.
 - b. *Business & Legal-Minded Volunteers* – Engaging businesses in the community to hire those currently unemployed in addition to helping assess and manage risk of daily REACH activities. Specific opportunities include being a part of the team and will evolve from collective team strategy meetings. Five volunteers are needed with flexible hours based on team availability.

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28. **DRAWN TOGETHER TEAM** – Artists, illustrators, graphic artists and crafters working together to illustrate principles in images rather than words. Creating supportive graphics and artwork for fundraising events, as well as teaching art. Create items that can be sold through team events, etc.
- DT Team Leads* – Leading/organizing event, implementing vision, working with REACH Director, communicating with volunteers, etc.
 - Artists* – (Graphic Artists, Illustrators, etc.) Donating their skills to create graphics and other art for the REACH team, REACH auction, Peru mission and items that are in demand in other ministries.
 - Business Marketer* – Looking for opportunities to monetize the things created.
29. **FLIPPERS TEAM** – Volunteers of all skills come together to donate their time and resources as God leads them to give a house a facelift with the intentions of selling for a profit. General labor for sweeping, demo, cleaning, lunch and supply runner, skilled positions for plumbing, electric, carpentry and more. Serving time annually based on timing of right property, project schedule, etc.
- FL Team Leads* – Works with the REACH Director to help with scheduling, communication, material purchase, etc. Serving time is completely dependent on the right house purchase and remodel schedule. Annual Event.
 - Contractors of all trades* – Carpentry, electrical, plumbing, flooring, painting, stone and tile.
 - Laborers* – Cleaning, demo, general labor, errands, etc.
 - Volunteer Admin* – Working with the REACH Director, communicating with volunteers, tracking expenses, communicating with teams, ordering supplies, etc.

(Each REACH Global Team requires one to two leaders to help coordinate events, follow up with prospective volunteers and communicate with the team. Serving time is based on team event schedule and volunteer availability. Some teams are still in need of leaders. If you are interested in leading please contact REACH Office.)

GLOBAL TEAMS – These initiatives support our ministry to Peru and facilitate trips and/or events to care for other mission needs in areas beyond our metro cities.

30. **JUNGLE JOURNAL TEAM** – Telling the story of Grace Mission in Peru through a timeline of events, fun facts, photos. Researching the technology to put this on a large touch screen in the foyer. Interactive map and timeline on the screen with dates, villages, missionaries, pastors, etc. Purpose is awareness and support. (This screen can also have a Grace History Journal Section.)
- JJ Team Leads* – Leading/organizing event, implementing vision, working with the REACH Director, communicating with volunteers. One to two volunteers needed with flexible serving time while working remotely most of the time.

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- b. Writers – Manage the blocks of text and provide to our Content Administrator for approval. One to two volunteers needed with flexible serving time while working remotely most of the time.
 - c. Jungle Historians – Gather and confirm all facts, data and photos. One to two volunteers needed with flexible serving time while working remotely most of the time.
 - d. Grace Historians – We will create a section for Grace church history. One to two volunteers needed with flexible serving time while working remotely most of the time.
31. **WORLD TRIPS TEAM** – Help in researching, planning and organizing mission trips.
WT Concierge Assistants – Volunteers who understand travel, work with team lead and missionaries on the ground to help research trip options, travel prices, hotels, stops, excursions, bus, boat and other transportations, vaccinations required, etc.
32. **PERU INTERNS** – Looking for the next generation of staff missionaries to answer the call to live and work in the Grace house in Yurimaguas Peru ministering to the Shawi people. Young couples who are interested in long-term missions working with our current missionaries and people group. Specific criteria required. Participation dependent on application acceptance. Serving time 1-10 years based on desire and effectiveness.
