3 Causes of Failure

Arrogance – <u>overestimating</u> my strengths.

Matthew 26:31a, 33-35 (TPT)

Along the way Jesus said to them, "Before the night is over, you will all desert me." ... Then Peter spoke up and said, "Even if all the rest lose their faith and fall away, I will stand beside you, Jesus!" "Are you sure, Peter?" Jesus said. "In fact, before the rooster crows a few hours from now, you will have denied me three times." Peter replied, "I absolutely will never deny you, even if I have to die with you!" All the others said the same thing.

Self-protection – <u>overvaluing</u> my safety and comfort.
