Place in life: The <u>last prophet</u> of Israel before the 400 years of

silence.

Calling: To <u>challenge</u> God's people to be totally devoted.

Devotion: The act of dedicating everything to a person, cause, enterprise, or activity, being completely loyal to someone.

God's love towards His people:

Malachi 1:2a (NLT)

"I have always loved you" says the Lord.

His people's response back to God:

Malachi 1:2b (NLT)

"Really? How have you loved us?"

Malachi 3:17-18 (NLT)

"They will be my people", says the LORD of Heaven's Armies. "On the day when I act in judgment, they will be my own special treasure. I will spare them as a father spares an obedient child. Then you will again see the difference between the righteous and the wicked, between those who serve God and those who do not."

Give God the very best of me.

Malachi 1:6-8 (NLT)

The LORD of Heaven's Armies says to the priests: "A son honors his father, and a servant respects his master. If I am your father and master, where are the honor and respect I deserve? You have shown contempt for my name!" But you ask, "How have we ever shown contempt for your name?" You have shown contempt by offering defiled sacrifices on my altar. Then you ask, "How have we defiled the sacrifices?" "You defile them by saying the altar of the LORD deserves no respect. When you give blind animals as sacrifices, isn't that wrong? And isn't it wrong to offer animals that are crippled and diseased? Try giving gifts like that to your governor, and see how pleased he is!" says the LORD of Heaven's Armies.

Colossians 3:23 (TPT)

Put your heart and soul into every activity you do, as though you are doing it for the Lord himself and not merely for others.



Stay committed to those I've promised to love and serve.

Malachi 2:10-11 (NLT)

Are we not all children of the same Father? Are we not all created by the same God? Then why do we betray each other, violating the covenant of our ancestors? Judah has been unfaithful, and a detestable thing has been done in Israel and in Jerusalem. The men of Judah have defiled the LORD's beloved sanctuary by marrying women who worship idols.

Malachi 2:13-16 (NLT)

Here is another thing you do. You cover the LORD's altar with tears, weeping and groaning because he pays no attention to your offerings and doesn't accept them with pleasure. You cry out, "Why doesn't the LORD accept my worship?" I'll tell you why! Because the LORD witnessed the vows you and your wife made when you were young. But you have been unfaithful to her, though she remained your faithful partner, the wife of your marriage vows. Didn't the LORD make you one with your wife? In body and spirit you are his. And what does he want? Godly children from your union. So guard your heart; remain loyal to the wife of your youth. "For I hate divorce!" says the LORD, the God of Israel. "To divorce your wife is to overwhelm her with cruelty," says the LORD of Heaven's Armies. "So guard your heart; do not be unfaithful to your wife."

Malachi 3:8-9 (NLT)

"Should people cheat God? Yet you have cheated me! But you ask, 'What do you mean? When did we ever cheat you?' You have cheated me of the tithes and offerings due to me. You are under a curse, for your whole nation has been cheating me."

My generosity guarantees more of God's rich provisions.

Malachi 3:10 (NLT)

"Bring all the tithes into the storehouse so there will be enough food in my Temple. If you do," says the LORD of Heaven's Armies, "I will open the windows of heaven for you. I will pour out a blessing so great you won't have enough room to take it in! Try it! Put me to the test!"

3 characteristics God demands from every Christian when it comes to stewardship:

- We must be <u>sacrificial</u> in our giving.
- We must be <u>consistent</u> in our giving (every time we receive income).
- We must be <u>cheerful</u> in our giving.

2 Corinthians 8:9 (TPT)

For you have experienced the extravagant grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that although he was infinitely rich, he impoverished himself for our sake, so that by his poverty, we become rich beyond measure.

Malachi 4:1-2 (NLT)

The LORD of Heaven's Armies says, "The day of judgment is coming, burning like a furnace. On that day the arrogant and the wicked will be burned up like straw. They will be consumed—roots, branches, and all. 'But for you who fear my name, the Sun of Righteousness will rise with healing in his wings. And you will go free, leaping with joy like calves let out to pasture."

Proverbs 3:5-6 (NLT)

Trust in the LORD with all your heart; do not depend on your own understanding. Seek his will in all you do, and he will show you which path to take.

Nahum 1:7 (NLT)

The LORD is good, a strong refuge when trouble comes. He is close to those who trust in him.

Malachi 3:3 (NLT)

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
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
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
