- **_____ -promotion -**
They elevate their beliefs and themselves above everyone.

- **_____ suggestions and leading questions -**
They are terrific at guessing and reading people.
- **Conflict to Scripture -**
Everything they say will appear to be truth but ultimately contradict scripture.
- **Undermining faith in God -**
They will develop in you a dependence on what they say, requiring a level of faith that ultimately leads you astray from faith in God.
- **Spiritual deception -**
They appear to communicate with the dead or energy forces in the universe, even though scripture says to avoid this type of paganism.
- **Moral ambiguity -**
Astrology and similar practices will develop in you a contrary world view instead of a biblical worldview.
- **Psychological impact -**
These practices will often develop anxiety, confusion, and deep disappointment, instead of the peace and clarity God brings through His Word.
- **Cultural and social pressure -**
With the increased influence of social media, many Christians are feeling social pressure to participate in these unbiblical practices.
- **Distraction from our true purpose -**
Focusing on Astrology and these practices will always result in distracting us from the voice of truth and God's purposes.
