Benaiah means "The Lord has built."

Hindsight bias – Because we know the <u>end</u> of the story, we assume it was inevitable.

- Before <u>David</u> volunteers to fight Goliath, we know he wins.
- Before the <u>wise</u> <u>men</u> follow the star, we know they find the Messiah.
- Before Peter gets out of the boat, we know he walks on water.
- Before <u>Jesus</u> is crucified, we know He rises from the grave.
- Before <u>Benaiah</u> kills the lion, we know he will be victorious.
