3 Keys to Get Real:

I must humbly admit I need help.

James 4:6 (NIV)

But he gives us more grace. That is why Scripture says: "God opposes the proud but shows favor to the humble."

1 John 5:14-15 (NIV)

This is the confidence we have in approaching God: that if we ask anything according to his will, he hears us. And if we know that he hears us—whatever we ask—we know that we have what we asked of him.

4 Reasons We Don't Admit Our Need for Help:

- Pride says, "I've got this."
- Fear shouts, "What will people think if they know..."
- Shame whispers, "God doesn't want someone like you."
- Control repeats, "If you let go, everything will fall apart."

4 Admissions to be Truly Changed:

- I need to admit I am broken.
- · I need to admit my secrets make me sick.
- I need to admit my sin to defeat it.

Proverbs 28:13a (GNT)

You will never succeed in life if you try to hide your sins.

I need to admit my <u>pride</u> and <u>fear</u> keep me stuck.

I must sincerely ask God for help.

2 Corinthians 1:9 (LB)

We felt we were doomed to die and saw how powerless we were to help ourselves; but that was good, for then we put everything into the hands of God, who alone could save us, for he can even raise the dead.

If I don't ask God for help, I pay the price in 3 ways:

- Emotionally: Stress, anxiety, guilt
- Relationally: Walls go up and intimacy breaks down
- Spiritually: Sin creates distance from God
