I forgave your entire debt when you begged me for mercy. Shouldn't you be compelled to be merciful to your fellow servant who asked for mercy?' The king was furious and put the screws to the man until he paid back his entire debt. How To Forgive Completely:

Reveal my hurt and let God's light shine through me.

1 John 2:9-11 (MSG)

Anyone who claims to live in God's light and hates a brother or sister is still in the dark. It's the person who loves brother and sister who dwells in God's light and doesn't block the light from others. But whoever hates is still in the dark, stumbles around in the dark, doesn't know which end is up, blinded by the darkness.

Release my offender, over and over again.

- 1. Make a list of names and pray.
- 2. Imagine how I would like to be approached.

4. Show up with the right attitude.
